





Schoharie County Sunshine Fair Dedication SANDI EMANUEL



Schoharie County lost a valuable member of the Agricultural Community with the unexpected passing of Sandi Emanuel in December 2023.

Sandi, along with her late husband Bruce, owned and operated the Emanuel Stables in Richmondville. From their home, they hosted 4-H clubs over the years, taught riding lessons, boarded horses and took clients to horse shows.

Sandi was active in Schoharie County 4-H Equine program, by leading 4-H clubs, coaching horse bowl, hippology and horse judging team to many regional, state and national championships. Several community service projects improved the area, the most recent was improvements to the horse show stabling at the Cobleskill Fairgrounds, and establishing the Bruce Emanuel 4-H Horse Barn.

As an active member in the YoSchoHaro Riding club, established in 1946, Sandi served the club in many capacities including President and Treasurer. She and her husband Bruce were instrumental in raising money for the Youth Scholarships. Sandi was the annual horse show chairperson for many years. Her talents for organizing the annual event were second to none.

Sandi served in many capacities in the New York State Saddle Horse Association, including several terms as President. She served as chairperson for their annual Fall Round-Up Horse Show, initiated the Spring Fling Horse Show, served on the Youth of the Year committee, Rules Committee and others.

As a past President of the NYS Quarter Horse Association, and her involvement in the Equine Valley Association, Sandi's efforts drew world champion caliber Quarter Horses, Palomino and Buckskin horses to come and compete at the fairgrounds.

The Sunshine Horse Show Series circuit, based at the Cobleskill Fairgrounds, had much to be thankful for, with Sandi's help. She worked tirelessly to help with the rules, host shows, organize the annual year-end awards banquet and promote the series.

With the State University of New York at Cobleskill, Sandi served as the Equestrian Riding Coach, helping the teams win National titles, traveling to North Carolina several times and as far West as California for the Finals.

Sandi's love for the community was clearly shown by her serving as President and also on the Board of Directors for many terms, with the Schoharie County Agricultural Society. Her heart was into making the Cobleskill Fair Horse Shows the best in New York State. Sandi worked year round to improve the shows. At the fair, she hosted rated shows with the Welsh Pony & Cob Society of America, the American Miniature Horse Association, American Shetland Pony Association and the Pony's of the Americas Inc., plus Open English, Western and Driving shows during the fair. The Donkey & Mule Show was also initiated by her efforts. Sandi's most recently served as Vice-President, with her term ending in 2021.

Sandi strived to make the Cobleskill Fairgrounds one of the best in the East. Her special touch and fundraising efforts improved the stabling, food court, outdoor arena and saw the covered arena built to be functional and aesthetically pleasing to the historic fairgrounds.

More than anything, Sandi was a person of the community. She should be recognized for encouraging and assisting others, especially youth, without personal gain.

NYTPA SANCTIONED TRACTOR PULL

Tractor pulling, also known as power pulling, is a motorsport competition that began prior to the invention of the tractor, when farm implements were pulled by horses. Farmers would boast about the strength of their teams and seek to compare and contest against one another to see who had the most powerful animals. It wasn't until 1929 when motorized vehicles were first used, and the sport did not really become popular until the '50s and '60s. So, come see what began many years ago when farmers came out of the fields to the local fair with hopes of taking home bragging rights by pulling the heaviest weight the furthest first with horses and



now tractors. These much-anticipated events bring pulling enthusiasts from all over the Northeast and beyond. It's loud but so much fun!

The NYTP Sanctioned Tractor Pull is Friday, August 9th, at 6pm.



TRUCK PULL



The Raptor Project

Jonathan Wood

A boyhood spent growing up in the National Seashore wilderness of New York's Fire Island nurtured. Jonathan Wood's fascination with birds and birding. A chance encounter with a young falcon stranded on the beach lured him into the ancient art of falconry. He started training falcons at age twelve and by age sixteen was a recognized ornithologist, writer and wildlife photographer with his own weekly bird column.

In 1996 Wood founded Raptor Project Inc., training and caring for the largest traveling collection of birds of prey in the world, with raptors from a wide variety of habitats and countries. Jonathan is one of the few professional master falconers in America delivering over 700 lectures, shows and large exhibits across the U.S. annually affecting millions of fans.

Wood is a federally licensed Master Falconer, Wildlife Rehabilitator, Raptor Propagator and is also licensed to handle eagles and endangered species for educational programs.

His expertise has placed him in demand as a consultant to national zoos and he works regularly on movies, documentaries, commercials, theatrical productions and books. In 2003 he was awarded the National Conservation Medal at Constitution Hall in Washington, D.C.

Jonathan Wood is the inspiration for the character Jon Wood in the popular novel *Frightful's Mountain* by award winning author Jean Craighead George.

His frequent road tours take him to many major events, fairs and festivals as well as a variety of colleges, schools, museums and wildlife centers. Along with his feathered friends he is regularly highlighted on national television including Animal Planet, The Discovery Channel, National Geographic Explorer, The Learning Channel, The Today Show, Good Morning America ,The Early Show, Regis and Kelly, Fox and Friends, CNN, ESPN, PBS, CBN and TBN .

In 2011 Jonathan Wood produced *Extreme Raptors*, the world's largest birds of prey show for Six Flags Theme Parks Inc.

In 2003 Jonathan Wood was awarded the National Conservation Medal at Constitution Hall in Washington, D.C. for outstanding achievement in environmental awareness.

Between busy road tours, Jonathan, his wife Susan and daughter Rachel reside in the heart of New York's Catskill mountains and winters are spent at their home on North Padre Island on the Texas Gulf coast.

Currently Wood is a sponsored member of Nikon's Birding Prostaff.



Things to see in 2024

Discover Heritage Village

You will be swept off your feet as you witness the many historical hands on displays and activities found in **HERITAGE VILLAGE**.

Laurel Dabbs will demonstrate the art of decoy carving, using traditional materials, hand tools and methods. All the different stages of making a gunning decoy, from pattern making to finish sanding, will be available as a hands-on display, along with a traditional cedar hunting boat and antique and working decoys. Educational displays from museum exhibitions will highlight the decoy's rich history, and painting tutorials will be offered each day as weather permits. Make & take projects and activities for children of all ages will be provided. Come and learn more about this most American of folk arts.

Blacksmith, Lewis Riggleman, will set up his blacksmith shop and provide a traditional demonstration producing various forged items in appropriate dress and along with his wife, Dianne, who will set up circa 1900 rope winding station and provide hands-on demonstrations resulting in a 6' length, 6 or 12 strand 3 lay rope.

Paper marbler, John C. Bielik, is an itinerant artisan, instructor, and historic trades preservationist. You will be amazed as he magically transforms plain paper with colorful and creative designs. A "mini" weight sled is hooked to a pedal tractor and each child pedals to pull the sled down the track until they make a full pull or run out of power on a 30' track. A full pull entitles the child to another chance, with weight added to the sled, until a winner is determined. There are 5 different "classes" based on the child's weight. The child with the longest distance in each weight class wins. Weight classes are 30-40 lbs, 41-50 lbs, 51-60 lbs, 61-70 lbs, and 71-80 lbs.

The child is weighed as he or she signs up for this event to determine the appropriate weight group. The pedal tractors are provided and every child receives a ribbon. There is no fee to enter, so come and participate or watch the fun on Thursday, August 8th at 7:00pm east of the Hall of Agriculture.

Dairy, An Important Part Of Agriculture

Dairy livestock will be on exhibit during the week of the Schoharie County Sunshine Fair beginning Tuesday, August 6th through Sunday, August 11th.

Whether you live in the country or the middle of town, the fair gives everyone the opportunity to see the many different aspects of agriculture. During the fair, the dairy barn will be full of dairy cattle and people willing to share what it takes to care for these animals.Farmers work hard every day and the fair gives them the opportunity to share this experience with

the community. They do this by answering questions to better educate the community about dairy farming and all that is required.

Dairy shows are scheduled for Wednesday and Friday. These shows provide exhibitors the opportunity to demonstrate their hard work and commitment they have done throughout the year. You will hear about the major characteristics that the judge is looking for in the animals to determine how to rank them during the competition.Junior exhibitors compete in Showmanship classes demonstrating how well they "fit and prepare" their animals for the show and their knowledge of showing dairy animals. Showmanship is a competition between the exhibitors, while the dairy classes are focused on the characteristics of the animals and which ones portray the best traits for the dairy breed the animal represents. Come see the dairy cows again this year every day of the fair. Take the time to

visit with your friends and neighbors, as they take time to share their lifestyle with the community.

RABBITS

If you are looking for adorable entertainment, hop into the livestock barn to see fluffy rabbits and their owners. You will find rabbits of all colors and sizes on display at the Sunshine Fair. Did you know rabbits can be trained to use a litter box or that many rabbits like to play with balls and toys? Rabbits also can be trained to walk on a leash just like a dog. The bunnies seen at the fair will be shown based on their confirmation and breed standard, fiber and cleanliness. Rabbits are raised for both their meat and hair, depending on their breed. You can stop in and watch the rabbit show, where exhibitors will hold their rabbits on a table for a judge. There will be a Rabbit Hopping Contest for all Rabbits. Rabbit owners from all over the county are always near to answer your questions about their favorite pets.







Goats

Did you know goats are known to be one the oldest domesticated animals, being domesticated in the Fertile Crescent roughly 10,000 years ago?

Today, there are more than 200 recognized domestic goat breeds. There are three types of domestic goats – dairy, meat and fiber producing, all of which can be shown at the fair.

Their friendly nature makes them one of the more popular animals for children to show at the Schoharie County Sunshine Fair.

Dairy goats are judged based on their udder quality, breed characteristics and conformation just like a dairy cow. Goat milk is commonly made into yogurt, cheese, soap, creams and many more products.

Meat goats are judged on conformation, muscling and market readiness. Although it is a less popular meat in the United States, goat is a delicacy for many cultures.

Goat exhibitors at the Schoharie County Sunshine Fair work hard to prepare their goats for the fair. Beginning in the spring, they handle their livestock daily, allowing them to become accustomed to people and being in a show collar. To see these curious little creatures, stop by the goat barn at the Schoharie County Sunshine Fair!

Sheep

Do you enjoy a delicious lamb roast for a Sunday family dinner? Or maybe you love a warm wool sweater on a chilly winter day. Sheep farmers all over the county help to make those things possible.

They work hard all year feeding, handling and shearing their sheep to produce meat,

and wool. Once a year at the Schoharie Sunshine Fair, these farmers have the opportunity to exhibit their animals and teach fairgoers all about their farm.

Depending on the breed of the sheep, it will be raised for wool or for meat. Breeds that are typically used for wool production include Romney's, Natural Colored, Cotswold, and Scottish Blackface.

Dorsets, Suffolks, Cheviots and Southdowns are widely known for their quality meat production.

To prepare for the Schoharie County Sunshine Fair, farmers will start by shearing off winter wool and working with the animals everyday to help them become accustomed to people. In the show ring, judges look for sound skeletal structure, muscling, breed characteristic and depending on the breed, wool quality.

It is something you have to see for yourself, so stop in the sheep barn to watch a sheep being sheared or fitted and ask one of our exhibitors questions about their sheep!

Swine

Being one of the most intelligent animals on the farm, exhibitors from all over the county raise hogs for breeding and market. Did you know pigs can be taught to come when you call their name?

Did you also know that pigs have an excellent sense of smell, and use their snout to navigate the world around them?

These smart creatures are shown in a fenced-in show ring and we can promise you will be thoroughly entertained as you watch their owners guide them around the open ring.

The pigs you see in the barns at the Schoharie County Sunshine Fair will be judged for either market or breed quality.



The hogs judged for market will be judged based on the correctness of their skeletal structure, overall muscle and readiness to go to market. These pigs will be shown throughout summer and then be sold to market.

Breeding pigs are judged for their breeding quality and characteristics and will be brought back to the farm to produce the show pigs for next year.

Stop into the Swine Barn at the Schoharie County Sunshine Fair to talk to an eager exhibitor and you might get to see a momma pig with a new litter of piglets!

FFA

FFA is a school-based agricultural education program, which promotes developing students' potential for leadership, personal growth and career success.

In Schoharie County there are currently four FFA programs with approximately 285 students actively participating.

The letters "FFA" stand for Future Farmers of America. These letters are a part of our history and our heritage that will never change, however FFA is not just for students who want to be farmers or work in agriculture; FFA also welcomes members who aspire to careers as teachers, doctors, scientists, business owners and more.

FFA continues to help the next generation rise to meet industry challenges by helping members develop their own unique talents and explore their interests in a broad range of agricultural career pathways.
